#### **School HR Drop-In Sessions**

# School equipment used in the home environment

Whilst schools remain closed to the majority of pupils, teachers will have considered lending school equipment to some pupils and their families. This can help reduce inequality and improve pupil access to online teaching and resources.

However, schools need to be alert to the possibility that devices in the home, connected to the home broadband connection, can be used to access inappropriate content. This may be directly harmful to pupils, and inappropriate content stored on the device will then be brought back into school and could potentially compromise the school systems.

The Department for Education's statutory guidance 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' obliges schools and colleges in England to "ensure appropriate filters and appropriate monitoring systems are in place. Children should not be able to access harmful or inappropriate material from the school or colleges IT system". Although school devices may be in a home environment, they are still part of the school's IT system and measures should be taken to mitigate against the risks of inappropriate activity.

If your school is sending equipment home, please consider whether you can reduce risks by:

- Asking parents to enable parental controls on their home broadband connection – most ISPs offer this at no additional cost.
- Enable filtering on the device if this is available e.g. through Lightspeed RELAY or a similar product.
- 3. Where possible, ensure that the device is monitored using Senso monitoring software or similar, and that key staff regularly review monitoring reports on pupil activity.
- 4. For Windows or Mac devices, ensure a suitable anti-malware product is installed and fully functioning.

#### **Early Career Framework Forthcoming Webinar**

The Early Career framework is being piloted in a number of areas, including Northumberland, from September 2020. All schools with new NQTs from September are strongly advised to sign up.

In conjunction with the North of Tyne Combined Authority, we are arranging a webinar containing an introduction to the Early Career Framework, with presentations by the four providers, to help schools decide which of the four providers is most suitable for them.
