NARROWING THE GAP CHAMPIONS PROJECT



Overview

Following the successful pilot this project in 2021/22, the Early Years Team are delighted to be able to offer this project opportunity again for 2022/23, providing practitioners with the chance to become 'narrowing the gap champions' for children in Northumberland.

Champions are essential in challenging stigma and increasing understanding of additional funding streams available to children in early years education. They are at the forefront of our ambition to make it commonplace for parents to access all funding streams available to support their children to be school ready regardless of the reason they are eligible.

Our movement has a monumental mission. To significantly narrow the attainment gap between disadvantaged children and their peers. We need the commitment of people who believe passionately that change must happen for ALL children in Northumberland to succeed.

The commitment for embarking on the project will include attendance at 2 live virtual training sessions in the autumn term in addition to an expectation that champions will write and implement their own 'narrowing the gap strategy' for implementing across the academic year. Participants will be able to access mentor support from the Early Years Team to write and implement their strategy in practice and there will be an opportunity to review the learning from the project and subsequent impact at the end of the year.

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INTRODUCTION TO CHILD PROTECTION

MANDATORY PRE-REGISTRATION TRAINING



Overview

We all have a duty to promote the safeguarding and welfare of all children and young people and to keep them safe from harm. This course is aimed at practitioners who have no previous child protection knowledge or training.

It is suitable for new practitioners in childcare and those in the process of registering with Ofsted as a childminder. It covers the basics of child protection and signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect. This is the basic requirement for child protection training, which forms a major part of safeguarding children and young people and is suitable for new staff/volunteers. It can act as a basic refresher if training was more than three years ago.

Learning Objectives

At the end of the session participants will have:

- their own attitudes, values and beliefs in relation to safeguarding
- identified and discussed definitions of abuse and neglect
- identified signs and signals of abuse and neglect
- identified risk factors which make children more vulnerable
- identified when and how to share concerns and make referrals
- discussed how to respond to disclosure
