### **Northeast Regional Modeshift Awards**

The Modeshift Regional Awards events took place in early November with 124 schools shortlisted from 28 Local Authorities across the country.

Northumberland was very fortunate to have 3 amazing schools nominated, with Allendale Primary School winning STARS School of the Region and School of



**the Local Authority.** A massive shout out to our other nominees Stannington First School and NCEA Bishops Primary School, who both did fantastically well.

Here's a quick snapshot of Allendale's achievements; car use has been reduced from 23% to 1% by encouraging park and stride as well as walking and wheeling to school and they have delivered over 150 initiatives since starting to work on STARS, ranging from setting up active breaktimes to starting a scooter club.

Good luck to Allendale Primary School will now represent Northumberland at the National STARS School Travel Awards event in March 2024.

#### International Walk to School Month


We had a fantastic Walk to School Month in October with 28 schools and almost 8000 pupils taking part in 4 weeks of themed activities.

W2SM continues to be one of our most popular initiatives and a great way to kick start the academic year. Some of the highlights this year included Cramlington Eastlea Primary's bike and hike to Blyth beach, a village walk with a Sea Shanty sing a long at Stamfordham Primary School and a bike stunt display show at Bishops Primary School.





#### Love Northumberland



Does your school have an amazing environmental project you want to tell the world about, then why not enter the **LOVE Northumberland awards**.

Now in their 14th year the awards are held in June at Alnwick Gardens and help to celebrate the very best in community environmental work across Northumberland.

In 2023 The Schools Sustainable Travel Award category was won by **Mowbray Primary School** with their **Sea to Source** project. There are several

### **Ride Leader Training**

We've had a bumper crop of school staff taking part in our Ride Leader training courses this year and have delivered 3 courses, training 25 school staff.

These staff are now accredited as Level 1 British Cycling Ride Leaders and can take pupils out on led rides in their local areas. We will let you know how they get on with their exciting cycling projects.

## Northumberland Line Rail Safety update

Work continues on the Northumberland Line ahead of passenger trains returning between Ashington and Newcastle in Summer 2024. Most of the track works have now been completed and works on constructing stations is well underway, with Ashington station almost complete.



As we head towards the start of passenger services, our attention is moving to getting rail safety messages out to schools that are close to the line.
