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1. North East Mayoral Strategic Authority

1.1 Create Growth Programme

The Create Growth Programme is designed for creative businesses with high-growth potential to become investment ready. Providing high-growth businesses between the seed and scaling stages, with the support and the investment they need to grow their business and turn their innovative creative ideas into the leading creative businesses of the future. Through a suite of business support initiatives, delivered in partnership with Creative UK and Innovate UK this tailored support for high growth creative businesses aims to develop businesses knowledge, skills and access to finance, so they are able to secure investment to enable growth, turning their innovative creative ideas into the leading creative businesses of the future. 1.2 Culture and Creative Investment Programme

The Culture and Creative Investment Programme, delivered in partnership with Creative UK, offers a combined package of financial and business support designed to grow the creative and cultural industries in the region. 1.6 Local Innovation Partnership Fund

The Local Innovation Partnerships Fund (LIPF) is a new, national programme led by UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) that will invest up to £500 million over five years to develop and scale high-potential innovation clusters across the UK. The North East has been identified in the Earmarked Strand, as one of 10 regions across the country to receive an allocation of at least £30 million funding over 5 years. 1.7 Northumberland Small Business Fund

NSBS, delivered by Business Northumberland as part of the North East Rural Growth Programme (NE-RGP), offers a comprehensive package of fully funded business support for individuals with a business idea and businesses across Northumberland. This includes a dedicated Food and Drink Support Service and a Farming Advisory Service, providing sector-specific expertise alongside general business support.

The support is designed to help businesses start, grow and improve resilience through tailored 1-2-1 advice, specialist consultancy, workshops, masterclasses and networking opportunities. 1.8 North East Property Fund

A £20 million property fund aimed at supporting smaller scale North East construction and property development projects will provide an important boost for the construction industry. The North East Property Fund has been created in response to strong demand from small and medium-sized (SME) construction and property development companies who are unable to access mainstream finance from traditional sources and is hoped it will help kick start development in smaller scale property ventures across the North East. 1.9 North East Commercial Property Investment Fund

A £35 million commercial property fund that supports developers in the North East.

1.10 The Mayor's Opportunity Fund

Partnered with Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and Northumberland and Point North to deliver the £1million Mayor's Opportunity Fund. The Fund supports the North East's commitment to a fairer North East through creating opportunity. Round two of the fund launched on 3 June 2025 and will invest £225,000 in supporting community-led places and spaces that meet people's basic day-to-day needs whilst also helping to create opportunity, improve skills, digital access and health outcomes, and reduce child poverty. 2. Grant Finder Service

2.1 The LGBT+ Fund: Get Active Fund

Funding is available for UK-based LGBT+ led non-profit organisations and groups delivering sports or physical activity projects. A maximum value of £50,000 is available, the application deadline is 4 November 2026. For further information [click here](#).

2.3 N-CODE Innovation Challenge: The Future of Neurological Healthcare

3.1 National Lottery Awards for All England.

4. Government Grant Service

4.1 Trees, woodlands and forestry - Woodland Creation Planning Grant

The Woodland Creation Planning Grant (WCPG) offers funding of up to £30,500 for the production of a UKFS-compliant woodland creation design plan. Landowners, land managers and public bodies can apply. WCPG is open for applications year-round. The 'Find a grant' tool requires a 'closing date' to be specified, however 31 March 2027 reflects the period WCPG funding is currently confirmed until, rather than a known closure date. The scheme was re-launched in autumn 2020 to enable more people to apply and help proposals move more quickly through the Environmental Impact Assessment process and future planting and establishment grant funding. 4.3 Life Sciences Transformational R&D Investment Fund (TRIF) Pilot

The Life Sciences Transformational R&D Investment Fund Pilot offers capital grants to support large-scale R&D projects in the UK life sciences sector (eligible projects must exceed £100 million in total costs). It aims to boost research and development within the UK's Life Sciences sector by supporting large-scale investments focused on innovation and strengthening health resilience, as well as projects with the potential to generate economic benefits. 4.4 Youth Jobs Grant

The Youth Jobs Grant is part of the Youth Guarantee and provides financial support to employers to encourage the recruitment of young people who may otherwise find it difficult to enter the labour market. It is intended to complement, not replace, existing recruitment activity. Eligible employers may receive up to £3,000 per job outcome, paid in stages and subject to meeting all scheme conditions. 4.5 Transferable Audio-Visual Equipment on Rail Replacement Coaches

The Department for Transport is providing up to £2 million in grant funding to support coach operators in delivering accessible journey information on rail replacement services. From the 1st of August 2026, these services will be required to provide clear, audible and visible information, including next stop announcements, in line with the Public Service Vehicle (Accessible Information) Regulations. The grant will reimburse up to 75% of the cost of purchasing transferable audio-visual equipment, helping operators meet these requirements and provide passengers, particularly disabled passengers, with greater confidence, independence and consistency when travelling during disruption. The scheme will run for six months, or until funding is fully allocated. For further information [click here](#).

4.6 Sustainable Drainage Systems (SuDS) in Schools Grant Scheme

The Department for Education (DfE) are pleased to announce that the Schools Water Strategy is now inviting applications for the Sustainable Drainage Systems (SuDS) in Schools Grant Scheme. The aim of the SuDS in Schools grant is to reduce surface water flood risk in the school estate. This is a match funded scheme and therefore, at the DfE's discretion and where the scheme criteria allow, the DfE can grant fund up to 50% of the total project costs. 5. Other News

5.1 Small venues Fund of £2.2m to launch in Autumn 2026.

North East Mayoral Strategic Authority to launch funding to back the North East's small venues and next generation of performers. Recognising the role venues play in local communities as well as the region's cultural identity, the new fund is designed to help creative spaces thrive and grow. The fund has been created to ease the rising pressures of running a venue and help protect the local places where North East talent takes its first steps. The three-year fund will deliver grants from £3,000 to £100,000 to enable small venues in the region of up to 300 seated capacity (or c.500 standing) to invest in equipment and infrastructure, or boost revenue-making operations. The fund has been shaped in partnership with the region's creative sector, with organisations including Generator working alongside the North East Mayoral Strategic Authority to help ensure investment responds to the needs of grassroots venues and the communities they serve. The fund will be open for applications in the autumn with an initial £800,000 in grants available in the fund's first year. Link to further details: [The Mayor's Small Venues Fund](#)
